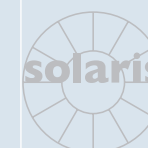

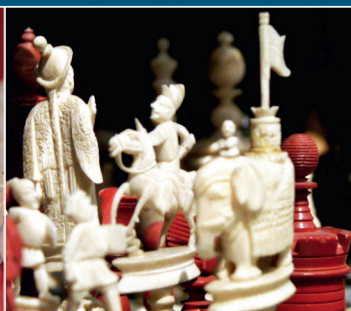

The four game principles

Our permanent exhibition „Historical games“ invites you on a discovery travel through the history of games.

According to the folk theorem (game theory), games can be divided into four main classifications, paralleling four categories of human occupation which define the most significant areas of life:

Games of Skill

occupation with nature, as far as we can explore and grasp it

- building and construction kits, puzzles, educational games, quiz...



Games of Chance

accepting outcomes and consequences beyond our control

- dice, ball-games, spinning tops, card-games, lotto...

Games of Strategy

calculating human reactions and behaviours with equal initial conditions

- Mahjong, chess, Go...

Mixed Games

simulation of and discussion of complex connections concerning our civilization

- economic games, crime games, travel- and fantasy games

Main emphasis of the collection

turn of the century games, first and second WW games, games of the 50ies, the German Democratic Union, games after 1985, construction kits, educational games, Game of the Year, prototypes, automats and special games.



The German Games Museum Association

The association was founded in Hamburg in 1986 by founding board member J. Peter Lemcke, it moved to Chemnitz in 1955. Chemnitz is a EU designated European Capital of Culture 2025.

Deutsches SPIELmuseum (German Games Museum)

The Deutsches SPIELmuseum was opened by the solaris corporate group in 1995 as the first private museum in the newly-formed German states. In 2011 it was donated to the solaris foundation.

The solaris foundation

Owner of the museum building, facilities and collection since 2012, the solaris foundation supports the association and funds/facilitates the consequent expansion of the collection.

The games collection

The stock of more than 35.000 games was purchased by Gert Gauder from the collectors J. Peter Lemcke and Helga Lemcke-Knoll and in 2012 donated to the solaris foundation. The collection of to date approx. 80.000 objects spans historical objects from the past 10 decades, aside from board games including all gaming materials and rules. The library registers old and new books of games literature as well as catalogues, documents and further games related exhibits, graphic arts and posters.

The heart of the house, the collection of historical games, has grown over the years through the enablement of the solaris foundation. An internationally noted gain is the collection Rühle with 3000 games spanning the period between 1945 and 1990.

Drawing not only from this treasure, the Deutsches SPIELmuseum on a regular basis issues new editions of historical games – in order to preserve the culture of games it is not sufficient to display them in shiny glass cabinets. They are simply too beautiful to only be looked at – they need to be played!
